#### Critter Control

Susan Blake has been dealing with gophers at the Firehouse Garden. There has been an onslaught of gopher mounds in the garden, especially along the rock area facing the building and on the top of the garden area. She treated a month ago with gopher gasser and pellets but that was not successful. "Since gophers eat roots, our flowers are being killed and also the big ponderosa tree will eventually be affected, not only by diminished roots but by air pockets around the root system." She then made joint arrangements with the Firehouse Training Center for help from professional exterminators. So far there has been no additional gopher activity after the treatment.

A friend of Louise Mounsey's has gotten rid of gophers by pouring used kitty litter down the holes. It doesn't hurt them, they just move out. She is trying it now and will let us know how it is working for her.


# Forest Heights Christmas Party with the Garden Club December 10, 2012

## November Minutes

**Evergreen Garden Club Minutes November 13, 2012** 

Barbara Steger, president, called the meeting to order at 9:40. Board members present included: co-vice presidents Grace Covyeau and Lynn Dimmick, secretary, MaryEllen Putnam, and treasurer, Roseann Paslay.

MaryEllen read the minutes from the October meeting and they were accepted.

Barb honored Beth Feldkamp for her years of service to the Garden Club. She edited the Wild Iris for ten years and also served as treasurer and vice president. The group shared a special cake in her honor.

Grace Covyeau invited guests as well as members who brought food for the group today, to choose an item from the gift table.

Treasurer Roseann Paslay distributed copies of the new budget and asked members to review it. She asked for a motion to pass the budget; Grace Covyeau made the first motion and MaryEllen Putnam, the second. The group voted and the motion was passed with all in favor.

To date in 2012, the Garden Club has earned \$850 from Safeway and Kings Sooper gift cards. Barbara Steger explained how easy it is to get the cards and use them. She asked all members to participate in the program.

Louise Nelson discussed the World's Children Organization and requested donations. The group's orphanages are world wide including India and Africa. Donations are used for basic needs: shelter, food and sanitation.
