A Wintertime Neighbor – The Dark Eyed Junco

There are a number of new (human) residents who have moved to the foothills area. Some of you have become members of Evergreen Garden Club. So, for those of you still familiarizing yourselves with our bird varieties, please note that there is one particular species many of us "long timers" are fond of: the dark eyed junco (Junco hyemalis).



While some area bird enthusiasts report the presence of juncos year-round, this bird's prevalence during our cold weather months adds a cheerful aspect to the environment. Juncos seem to become more noticeable and numerous around here as the autumn months progress with chillier temperatures and other birds, such as hummingbirds and robins, seek more "hospitable" climatic locations. Juncos can often be found hopping around yards, foraging for seeds left behind by various grasses and other plants from the growing season. If you have feeders, trays, or a ground location where songbirds may converge, juncos enjoy sunflower, safflower, and niger/nyjer seeds, millet, as well as bits of peanuts and peanut butter based suet-style cakes. They are also insect eaters, though they seem to get along without us supplementing them with bugs.

Junco population numbers are reportedly still high. So, hopefully, you shall be treated to their presence throughout the wintry months in your spot of nature!
