Evergreen Garden Club Minutes, January 2015

President, Susan Blake, called the meeting to order at 9:33 AM. Board members in attendance included, Co-Vice President, Paul Luzetski, Co-Vice President, Annell Hoy, Secretary, Jean Lipson, Treasurer, Patti Stefaniw, and Member Emeritus, Louise Mounsey. We had twenty seven members in attendance.

Cindy Gibson and Cherie Luke, our Welcoming Committee presented our guests today, Merry Loizeaut, Kitty Galles, and Sophie Pardo. A hearty round of applause was given to them; we welcome you. Warm and wonderful Birthday wishes were extended to Dianna Aldridge, Ginny Cerrillo, Kathy Lee, Irma Wolf, Marion Roberson, and Leslie Jordon. We hope that this will be a marvelous year for you.

Two new ideas were discussed. One was from Diana Alridge regarding the toilet paper Christmas Tree for EChO that we have been doing for several years. Diana found out that they have more than enough toilet paper and perhaps we should consider doing something different. Jean Lipson suggested that we give socks for folks of all ages. After much discussion it was decided that we should meet with the folks at EChO and have them give us ideas as to what would be helpful to donate.

The other new idea was from Annell Hoy who suggested that we put up a sign at the Dam Garden at Christmastime wishing the Evergreen community Happy Holidays, saying, "Happy Holidays to all from the Evergreen Garden Club" plus a suggestion was made that it be lighted at night. After some discussion on this issue it was decided that we needed to contact the Evergreen Metro District for their approval

Patti Stefaniw gave the treasures report; a motion was made and seconded to accept the report as presented. Patti also reminded us that by using our King Soopers or Safeway gift cards we can earn money for our EGC. If you need one, or are unfamiliar with how it works, be sure to see Patti. For a mere \$20.00, for a King Sooper card or \$10.00 for a Safeway card which she has for sale. The cards can be used at the respective stores and reloaded as needed for your groceries at the respective stores and can be reloaded either at the checkout counter or the service desk.

Jean Lipson asked for a motion to accept the minutes from the December meeting that appeared in the Wild Iris; a motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes as printed.

Our individual committee chairs had nothing to report.

Annell reported on the Rodeo Parade: she is having seed packages printed which we will be handing out at the Rodeo Parade on June 20. The front of the package will display information of the EGC Expo to be held, June 27, and the back side would display our EGC Logo, flower seed information and our web site for membership information. Lynn Dimmick told us that she will donate additional seeds that we can add to the mix that our members are donating. Annell will have a seed packaging party at her home where those in attendance will add a quarter of a teaspoon of collected seeds into each package.

Our upcoming Expo was discussed at great length; the following are the highlights of that discussion: Whereas the admission to the Expo is free there will be containers placed in strategic locations where folks can deposit their free will donation. Susan passed around

sign-up sheets for our members to sign up for their choice of activity that they would be willing and able to work the day of the Expo. She also reported that two people have offered vehicles for use in the Rodeo Parade, one is a 1963 pickup truck, and the other is a 1964 convertible. Barb Steger told us that Frank Dearborn from the Evergreen Department is working on parking for our big event. He is making arrangements for some of the parking to be available at Bergen Meadow Elementary School which is right behind the fire house and folks can easily access the firehouse by climbing the few steps that lead from that parking lot to the Expo. Additionally, she informed us that we will be featuring a plant sale, "How To" classes will be presented in the morning and again in the afternoon, plus we will feature information tables, retail booths and of course Annell and her crew will be selling bowls of Firehouse Chili! Barb also reported that we will be able to access the firehouse the day before the Expo enabling us to get things set up, however on Saturday, the day of the Expo; members need to be ready to go to work by 7:00 AM in order to get everything ready to go by 10:00 AM. Paul also reminded us that in order for this to be successful event members will need to be willing to do more than one thing. He added that there will be photos and interesting memorabilia from years past featuring our Evergreen Garden Club. Paul also told us that there will more parking directly across the street from the firehouse on Bergen Parkway, and that the entire firehouse parking lot will be used for handicapped parking.
