



## High Powered Perennials for High Altitude Gardens




8,700' IN ELEVATION EAST FACE BARREN - NO TREES INTENSE SUN WINDY STEEP

MUSHROOM COMPOST WAS ADDED TO THE HOLES WHEN FIRST PLANTED







This tall variety most likely would not stand up to the winds if its back wasn't against the wall; but it has been returning for 8 years. Powdery Mildew is an on-going issue, probably due to crowding :-)

## **BLANKET FLOWER** Gaillardia aristata



#### NATIVE! CRITTER RESISTANT DROUGHT TOLERANT POLLINATOR FAVORITE

Make sure the variety is <u>aristata</u>! It's not the easiest one to find and it won't look as good in the garden centers as the cultivators, but you will happier in the long run - so will the pollinators!


#### WOOLY THYME








