#### EVERGREEN GARDEN CLUB REFLECTIONS

#### 1965-2015

The Evergreen Garden Club was established in 1965 by Louise Mounsey and Gretchen Stoeppelwerth who perceived a need to help newcomers cope with the challenge of gardening at our altitude. At our first meeting we had eight people in attendance. Yes, even 50 years ago there were a few newcomers every year!

Our primary functions were envisioned as education and conservation. Not envisioned in the early formative years were the friendships which really played a major part of the organization. Friendships developed among many members, as past president, Joan Reynolds said, "Friendships are undying, they never even wilt!"

The club's first project was caring for a planter made of railroad ties that was located under the traffic light at the downtown intersection of highways 73 and 74. It was quite a challenge working in the early mornings before the heavy traffic started; we ran a water hose from the back of a small building on the north side of main street about 150 feet away. Try doing that today! Over the years, our studies have included annuals, perennials, bulbs, herbs, grasses, shrubs, trees, greenhouses, and many other gardening subjects; always being aware of our altitude.

The deer and elk were not even a problem in our gardens, 50 years ago. They were so rare that we would call our neighbors and friends when we saw one in the vicinity of our plants. For several years, our meetings were in the hospitality room at the Public Service building on Evergreen Parkway. When Xcel Energy bought the company they closed that room to public use, and we moved to the Church of the Hills. Now we meet at the Evergreen Fire and Rescue Training Center in Bergen Park September through June, the second Tuesday of the month at 9:00 in the morning.

Evergreen Garden Club has always been concerned about the environment and has participated in many projects in this mountain area to preserve and enhance our environment. May we continue with the goals of education and environmental stewards for at least another 50 years!
